A 19th century Sunday School teacher named Kimball led a Sunday School lad named Moody to Jesus Christ. That was 1858.

Dwight L. Moody left behind shoe clerking and became a famous evangelist who—twenty-one years later— so preached in London England that it transformed the life of Frederick B. Meyer whom Moody encouraged to preach on college campuses.

Meyer led a student named J. Wilbur Chapman to the Lord for salvation.

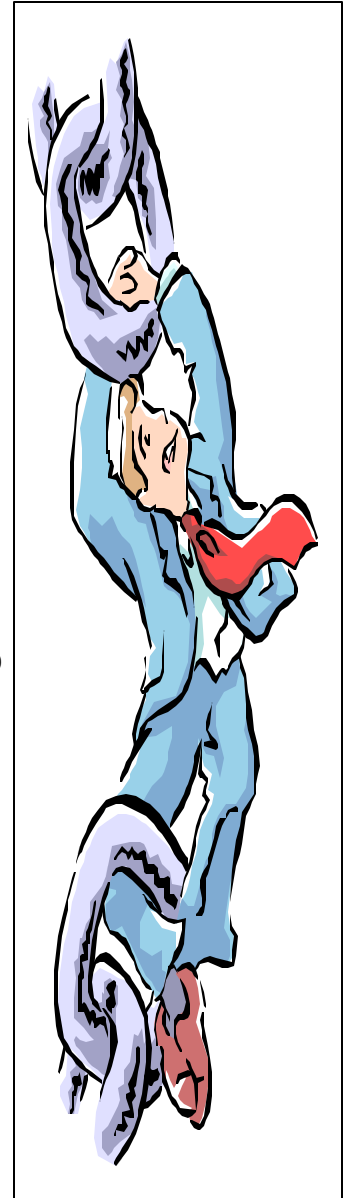
Chapman while working with the YMCA influenced a former baseball player named Billy Sunday to come to Charlotte, North Carolina to attend revival meetings.

Billy Sunday became a great revivalist, and in one of his crusades in Charlotte, a group of businessmen came to Christ. A year later they decided that their city needed another crusade, so they invited Mordecai Hamm to be their speaker.

After 3 weeks Hamm left town, discouraged because he'd only had one convert -- a 12 year-old boy called Billy Graham! Billy Graham has preached to more people than any man in history.

One Sunday school teacher started it all! One brother, Andrew, led another brother called Peter to Christ; and Peter brought multitudes. One woman, whose name he still doesn't know, led David Yonggi Cho, pastor of the world's largest church (800,000 members), to Christ. One person - just one - can make all the difference. You can be that one!

I am sure that Sunday School teacher in Boston had no idea what would happen from leading a lad named Moody to Christ.
