

# Bible Game— Scatagories

## Objective

Once the initial letter is chosen, to fill out the category list with the answers beginning with that initial letter and to score points for correct answers. The player with the most points wins.

## How To Play

Print this document. Cut out the game cards and letter pieces. Print the games cards as many times as you have players. Each player has identical cards for each round of the game.

1. The game is divided into three rounds. The players take a pencil and the game sheet, which has three columns, with 6 categories.
2. Put all the letter pieces into a bag or hat. A player chooses one piece of paper to decide what is the first letter to be used.
3. A timer or stopwatch is started. The players have two minutes to fill out one column on the page. The play-

ers must use the chosen letter to be the main letter in their answer. e.g. if the die letter is 'D' and the category is "People from the Bible" the player may guess "David" "Daniel" "Doubting Thomas" "The Two Debtors of Jesus' parable" etc.

4. When the time is up the players stop writing. The answers are viewed and each player corrects their own answers by circling any legitimate answers that do not match any of the other players answers. Zero points are given for duplicate answers and 1 point for any legitimate non-duplicate answer. Players may deem another person's answers invalid if the majority of the players agree on a verdict. For example "Deeply Religious" probably does not meet the intent of the category "A person from the Bible that starts with the letter D."

5. The second and third rounds are started by choosing a different letter.
6. The totals of all the rounds are added up and the winner is the player with the highest score. If there is a tie, an extra round is played to decide the winner.
