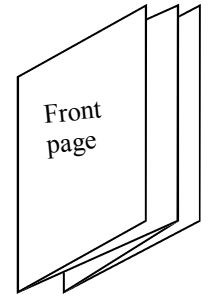
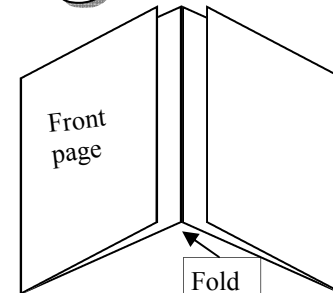
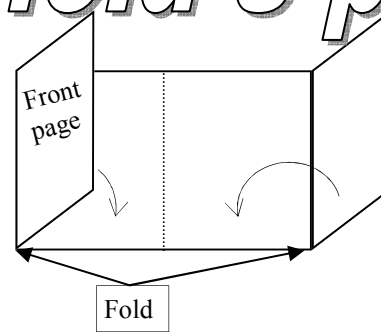
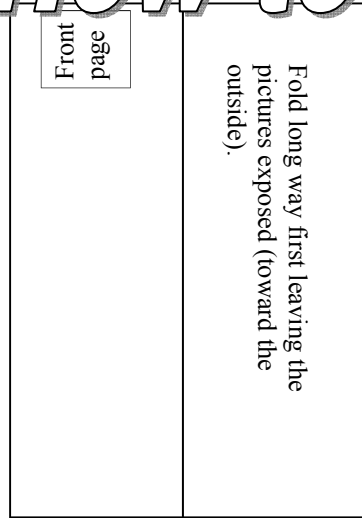
Directions:
