

Salvation in the Old Testament —Mini Books and Pictures

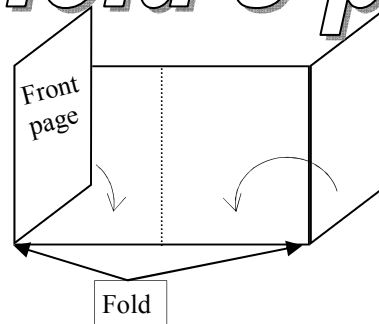
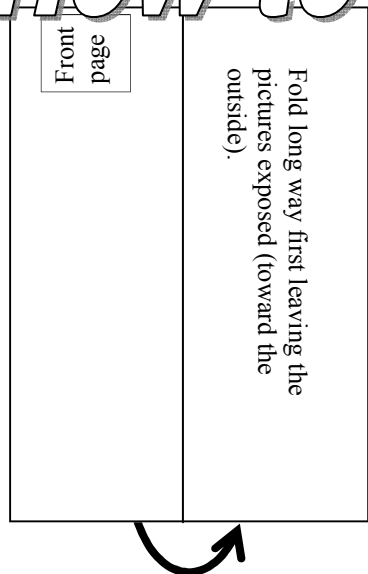
Directions:

2. Print the pages of your choice. Page 2 is a mini book with 8 pages. Pages 3 through 9 are full-sized pictures suitable for coloring or for telling a story on a classroom wall.
3. Folding instructions: For the 8 page booklet, start by folding the page in half the long way first.
4. Use the booklets and pictures to tell the story and then as a coloring project for the last few minutes of class. At the end of class, send the students home with a story to tell their parents and friends.

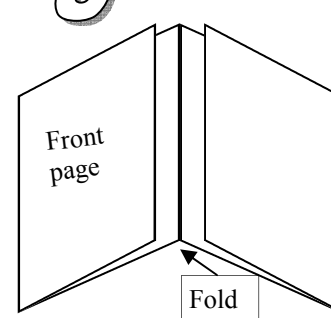

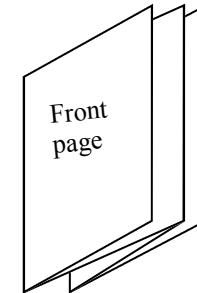
How to fold 8 page booklet



Fold first and last page to meet in the center.



Fold the center and bend backwards.



The final booklet is an accordion-style book.

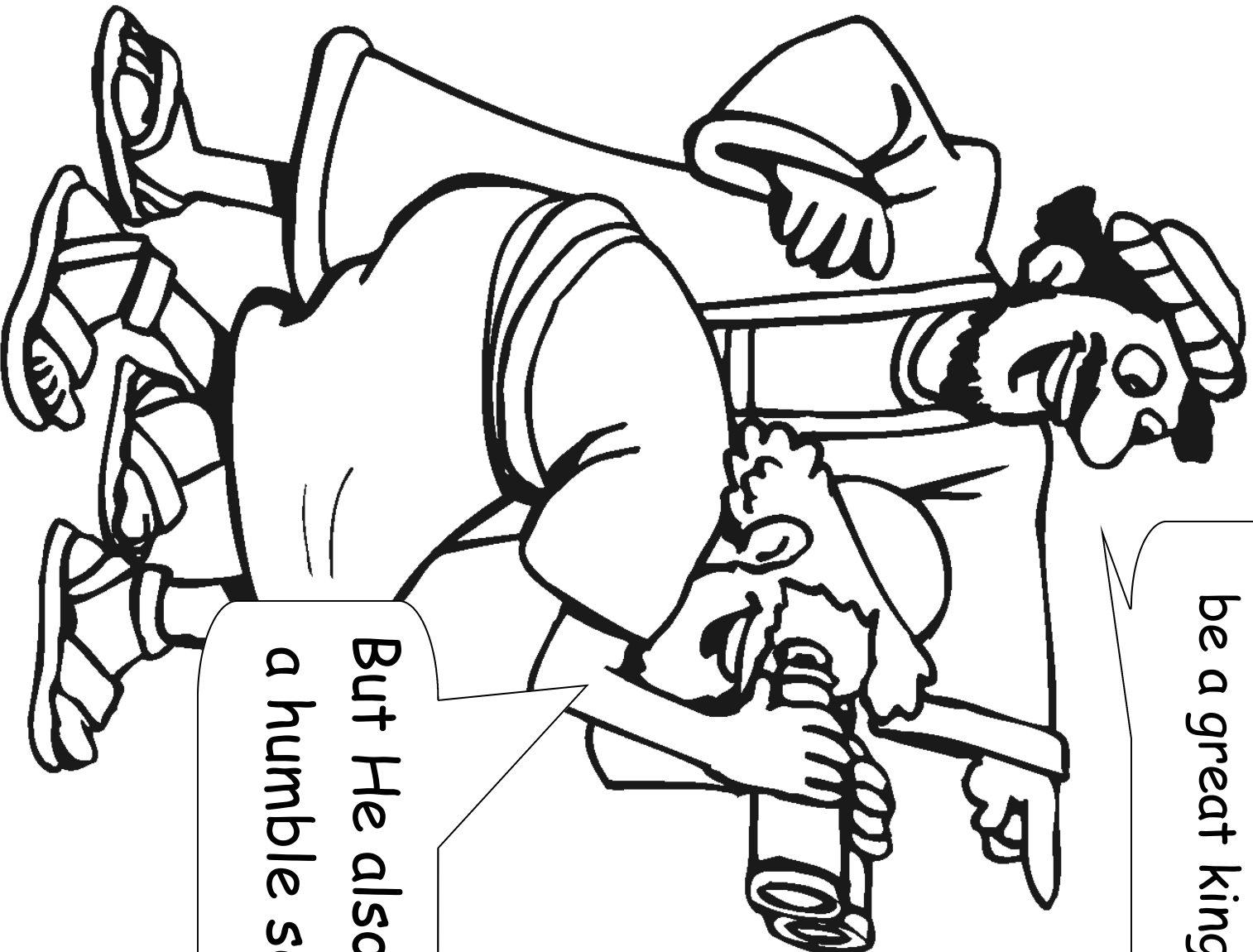
You can know that you are saved because the Bible says that Jesus died for your sins, but how were the people saved in the times before Jesus?

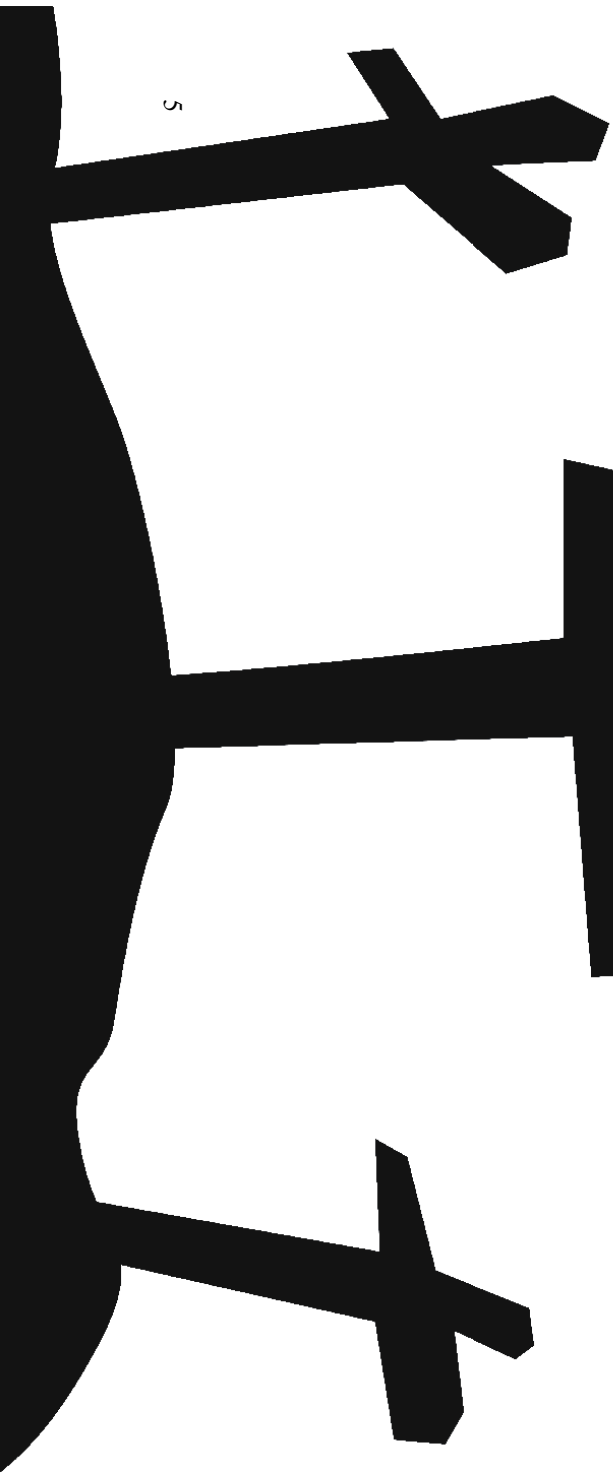
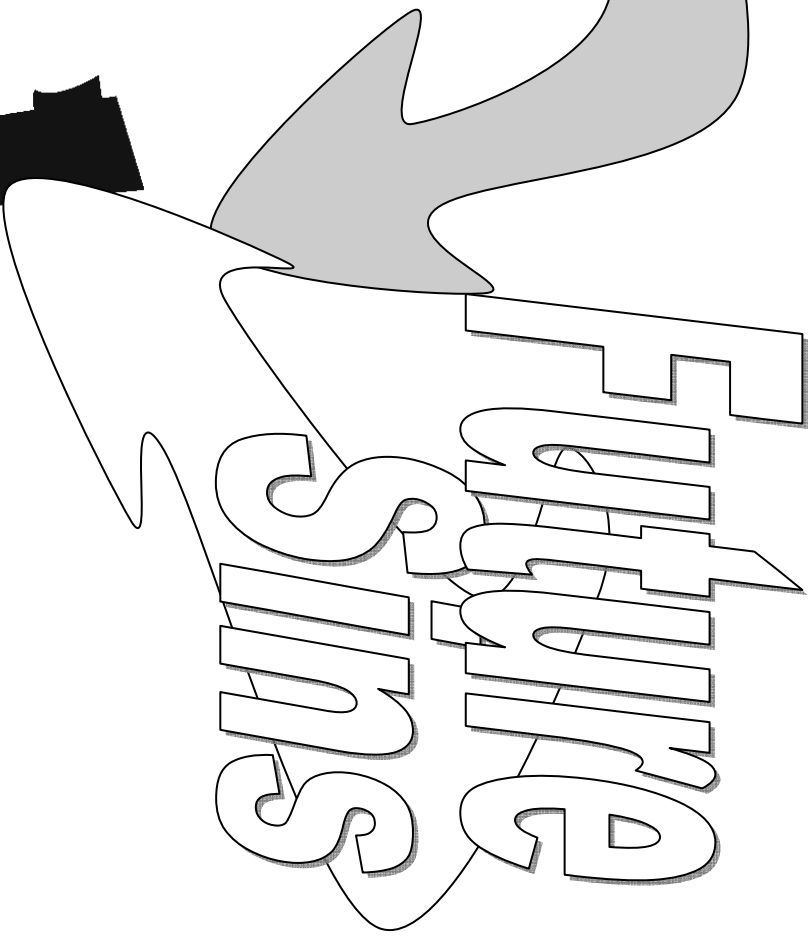

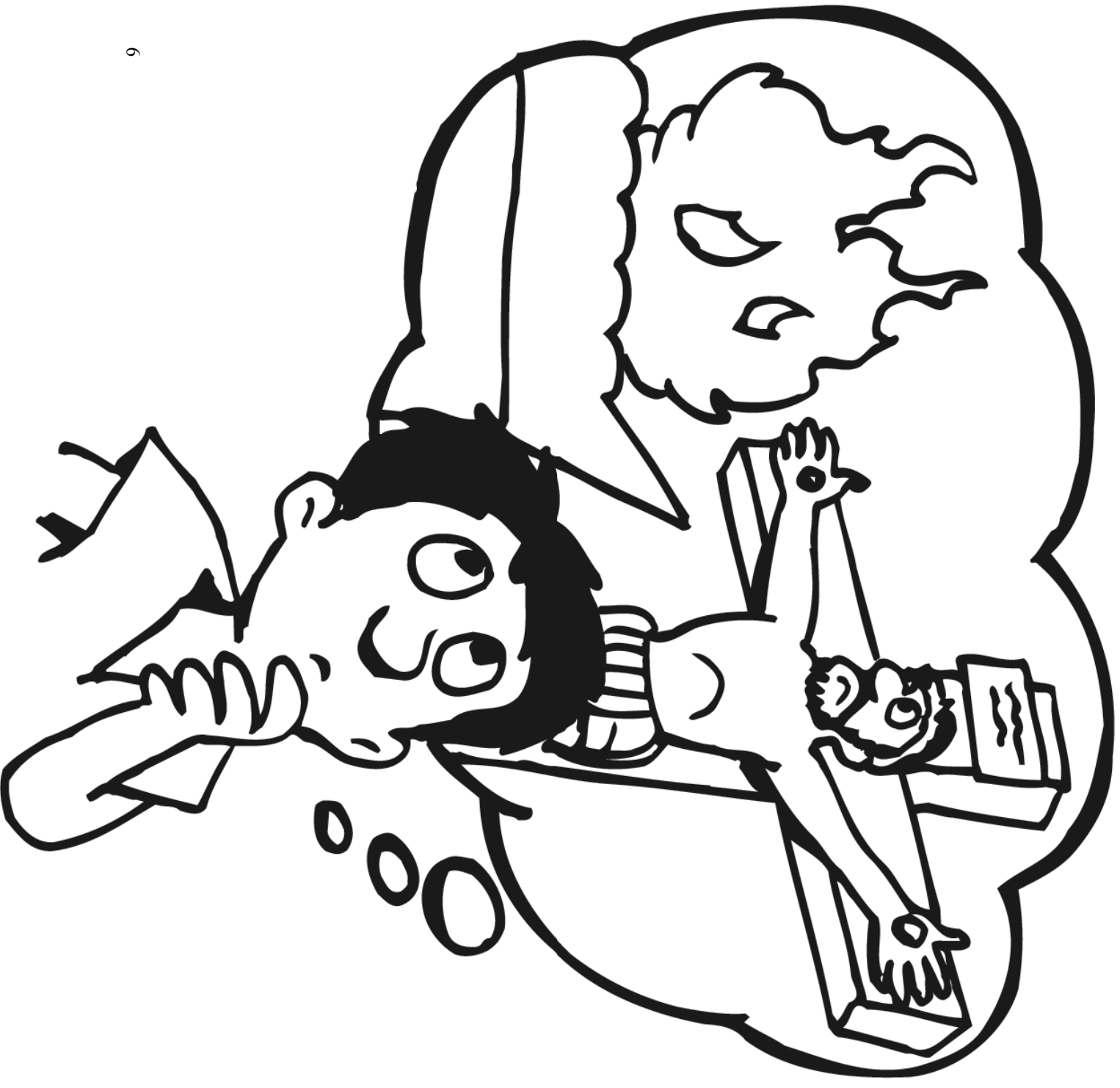
