

Moses Leads the Exodus—Mini Books and Pictures

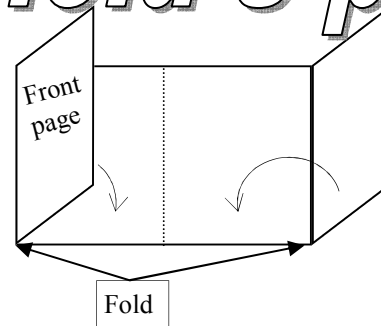
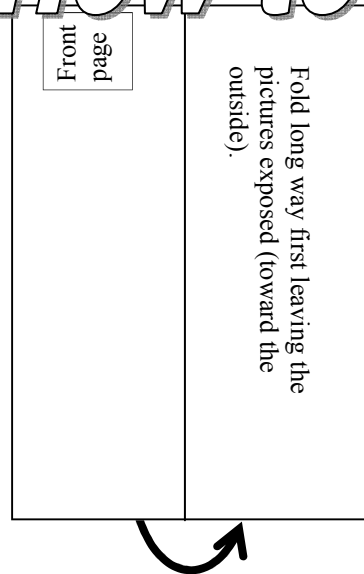
Directions:

2. Print the pages of your choice. Pages 2 to 5 are mini books with 8 pages. Pages 6 to the end are full-sized pictures suitable for coloring or for telling a story on a classroom wall.
3. Folding instructions: For the 8 page booklet, start by folding the page in half the long way first. Use the booklets and pictures to tell the story and then as a coloring project for the last few minutes of class. At the end of class, send the students home with a story to tell their parents and friends.

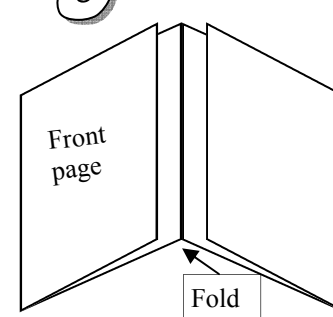

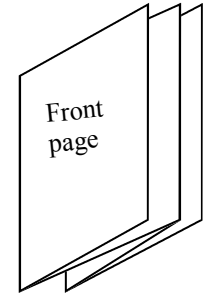
How to fold 8 page booklet
